Celebrating a Life Well Lived Dr. Alice Kidder 1941-2024



It is with profound sadness that we announce the passing of our cherished President, Dr. Alice Kidder, who passed away on March 10, surrounded by her family. Since the early 1990s her leadership has been the driving force behind our numerous programs and the establishment of the Green Street Shelter, a full-service 50-bed facility for homeless community members in Cambridge.

Dr. Kidder's life was a testament to her commitment to social justice. After earning her bachelor's degree from Swarthmore College and a PhD from MIT, she dedicated her academic career to researching critical social issues before turning her focus to Solutions At Work. Her legacy includes not only the programs she developed but also

the relationships she cultivated with individual donors and institutional supporters, which have been vital to our mission.

Our organization has grown and evolved under Dr. Kidder's visionary leadership. One example is the clothing exchange program, which provides essential clothing to those who cannot afford it, ensures individuals have access to appropriate attire for various occasions, from winter coats to professional clothing for job interviews. We will carry on Dr. Kidder's legacy as we remember her life.

Mental Health Awareness

Fighting homelessness requires a multi-pronged strategy. Thanks to a grant from the City of Cambridge, Solutions at Work provides Cambridge residents and shelters in Cambridge with assistance in dealing with their mental health challenges. The grant also funded additional resources in the form of an informational website as well as a physical brochure which shares vital information on treating mental health.

The Mental Health Program at SAW provides mental health services to our clients and other members of the Cambridge community through psychiatrists, psychologists, case managers and therapists. We reach out to individuals currently staying at various shelters but primarily the Green Street Shelter.

Solutions at Work has also forged several community partnerships to fight homelessness in Cabridge. SAW works with the African Community Economic Development of New England (ACEDONE) to operate the Green Street Shelter as well as New Vision, a private company which specializes in mental health services. SAW has also reached out to several homeless shelters in Cambridge to provide mental health services to their residents. We hope to secure additional funding to continue this vital program for combatting this often overlooked but root cause of much of our homelessness.
